USP Considerations

Internship taken will not count towards USP 100+ hour internship requirement for USP Majors

Many USP students use their UCDC internship as:

- A jumping off point for planning their Senior Research Project
- An initial data source and/or comparative context for SRP

Seminar course taken is USP 194

- 4 units taken for a grade or P/NP
- Courses taught at UC Center: Reducing Poverty and Inequity, General Research, World Politics in Interesting Times
- Need to determine if selected course is USP compliant
- USP 194 is generally accepted as a USP elective

Planning for UCDC - What? Why?



WHAT do you want to pursue?

UCDC Program (that's why you are here!)

Others to consider:

- Study Abroad
- UC Center Sacramento
- Research
- Volunteering
- On-campus and/or off-campus job
- Student club/organization
- College-specific programs
- Etc.

WHY do you want to pursue?

Self-reflection of academic journey, interests, goals, responsibilities, career prospects, etc.

This question is part of the application for almost **any** opportunity - think before you write!

Planning for UCDC - When?



WHEN do you want to pursue?

Program (UCDC) Deadlines - usually 2 quarters in advance

College, Department, and Program Advisors - Plan, plan plan!

Barriers and Restrictions -

- Academic level
- GPA
- Location-bound
- Quarter-specific
- Length of commitment

- Level of flexibility
- Housing
- Cost
- Conflict with other programs

How does UCDC count toward major?



Required Courses:

- Research Seminar Course USP 194, 4 units
- Internship Seminar Course AIP 197DC; 6-8-10 units options

Optional^{*} Course (Required only if enrolled in 10 units with courses above):

• EXPR 100 - Elective Course; 4 units

Ideally courses would have international content, but exceptions can be made based on offerings

Internship Questions to Ask Yourself

How soon to begin applying for internships in DC?

How many Internships should I apply to?

Can I have a paid internship?

Where can I begin looking for internships?

I don't have any relevant experience. Will that hinder my internship search?

Internship start and end dates: Most organizations are more familiar with semester students and therefore list their internship opportunities as starting and ending according to those dates. However, most of the time, they are open to quarter student schedules.

Eligibility for UCDC

Eligibility

Students from all majors are encouraged to apply and must meet the following eligibility requirements:

- 90 units completed
- At least 2 upper-division courses
- 2.5 GPA (3.0+ preferred)
- US citizenship is not required for the UCDC application
 - International students and DACA/AB540/Undocumented students are eligible to apply.
 - If you are a student without US citizenship status seeking to apply for UCDC, please refer to the FAQs for more information.

How to Apply

Application Materials

Complete applications must be submitted by the priority^{*} or final posted deadlines.

Application materials include the following:

In addition, we require the upload of the following documents to Internlink to complete your UCDC application:

- UCDC Application Form
- <u>Resume</u>
- <u>Cover Letter or Letter of Intent</u>
- <u>Two Letters of Recommendation</u>
 - Letters of Recommendation may be submitted online in InternLink, in person (AIP Office, Teaching + Learning Commons @ Geisel) or by email: ucdc@ucsd.edu
 - A faculty letter is not required, but we suggest one letter of recommendation from a faculty member

Earning Academic Credit

How Do I Reach 12 Units?

- 1. Internship Credit: AIP 197DC (Required, 6, 8, or 10 units, Pass/No Pass)
 - 1. Internship and related assignments and responsibilities. The units are upper-division general elective credit; check with your academic department regarding application of credit toward your major.

2. Research Seminar Credit: USP 194 (Required, 4 units, Graded or Pass/No Pass)

- 1. Development and completion of an independent and significant research project under the supervision of UC faculty, and guided by a teaching assistant. Students from departments other than those listed above should contact their academic department to determine if this course will be counted toward their major.
- 3. Elective Course Credit: *EXPR100 (Optional, 4 units, Graded or Pass/No Pass)*
- 4. Upper-Division Elective Course.

Major Credit: Students must check with their major department to apply credits toward their major.

Program Cost Overview



Academic Year Residential Program Cost

Tuition and registration fees are the same as for a quarter on campus, but the cost of living in Washington, D.C. may be higher. Students are also responsible for:

• Round trip airfare, local transportation costs, sightseeing activities, books, professional clothing, and other personal expenses.

Summer Residential Program Cost

If not taking units then students only need to pay housing costs and the items listed in the above bullet points. If taking units, students will be charged regular university tuition rates per unit.

Program Cost - Scholarships

UCOP Presidential Fellowship

This fellowship is usually offered during academic quarters.

<u>AIP</u>

These awards are made based on financial need and overall academic performance. These scholarships are available on a rolling basis as long as donations remain available.

Financial Aid

- Financial aid will apply to your the quarter you participate
- Students can meet with the Financial Aid Office to discuss adjustment of their awards due to difference in living expenses
